The Harry Fanos Chapter presented a lecture by Dr. Angelo Athanasopoulos on Friday, January 11, 2008 entitled "Prelude to the Greek War of Independence". The program was about the events that led to the 1821 Greek War of Independence against the Ottoman Turks and provides excellent preparation for our upcoming March 25th celebrations.

Dr. Athanasopoulos an energetic and engaging speaker used computer technology to make his presentations come alive. He has been our most popular presenter our chapter has sponsored in the last 8 years. This was his 7th Modern Greek History presentation to the Stamford community. He holds a Political Science degree from Northeastern University, a Masters Degree from the University of Massachusetts, and a Doctorate from Boston University in the field of Media and Technology in Education.

On February 15, the chapter offered a lecture on Hellenic history education: 'Alexander the Great: Lessons from the Past'. A presentation and book signing by the esteemed classical scholar and historian Dr. Guy MacLean Rogers, Macricostas Chair of Hellenic Studies, Western Connecticut State University was presented to the community. Dr. Rogers is the author of 'Alexander: The Ambiguity of Greatness', was the product of over ten years of research. Dr. Rogers holds a Ph.D. in classics from Princeton University. His achievements include numerous grants and fellowships, including those from the National Endowment for the Humanities, the American Philosophical Society, and All Souls College, Oxford.

1. ELIGIBILITY

- A. Applicant must be currently attending college or postgraduate school and plans to enroll as a full-time matriculated student in the next academic year.
 - B. The applicant must satisfy **one** of the following:
 - i. The applicant is a member of an AHEPA family organization of District Seven
 - ii. The applicant is a child of a member of an AHEPA family organization of District Seven
 (Both **MUST** be in good standing (paid per capita) Nationally and in the District)
- In addition, the applicant must satisfy all of the following:
- C. The applicant or the parent of the applicant must complete one year (12 months) of membership in an AHEPA family organization prior to the deadline of this application.
 - D. Applicant must have at least a 2.5 GPA.
 - E. The application portion of the Verification of Eligibility form, below, must be completed and signed by the Chapter President.
 - F. Applicants may re-apply if they continue to meet the requirements *and* have not received two previous grants from the Yankee District #7 Scholarship Foundation.

2. AWARDS

Scholarships will be awarded at a special AHEPA District Seven event. Recipients will be notified and be invited as honored guests of the District at the event, at which time they will each receive an award certificate. Award winner or parent/guardian should attend to receive award. If award winner cannot attend, the committee must be contacted prior to the award ceremony. The actual checks will be issued upon receipt of an enrollment verification in the fall.

3. FILING

All information requested must be submitted for the application to be considered complete. **Incomplete applications will not be officially accepted and filed.**

Only information requested herein will be evaluated. Letters of recommendations and testimonials are not required.

Awards are given primarily on the basis of academic achievement, community service.

All materials requested must be submitted to the Scholarship Committee Chairman, by the deadline.

All materials submitted will be held in strict confidence and are not returnable.

The following materials must be submitted:

This application, filled out, typed or legibly printed in its entirety.

An **official** transcript from the most recently attended academic institution. Official transcripts must be received directly from the academic institution.

A certificate of enrollment or admission letter from the academic institution you are planning to attend.

On a separate sheet of paper submit a typed essay of at least seven hundred (700) words and no more than on one thousand (1,000) words. Choose one topic from those listed in section five (5) of the application.

The Danbury chapter hosted its monthly film festival "Iphigenia" on Friday, November 30, 2007 at 7PM at the community hall of the Assumption Greek Orthodox Church. The admission was Free, complementary pasta and salad buffet was served.

The 1977 film *Iphigenia* teamed two Greek titans of the arts. On the one hand, Euripides, whose 2,500 year career shows no signs of slowing, and on the other, Michael Cacoyannis, the Cyprus-born film director who brought Zorba to life in the classic 1960 film version of Nikos Kazantzakis's masterwork.

Iphigenia (adapted from the play *Iphigenia at Aulis*), is at surface a characteristic Greek tragedy-cum-soap opera with all the ingredients of a top notch soap : betrayal, ambition, greed, lust for power... Set against the backdrop of the Trojan War (or the mobilization for the war, to be exact), *Iphigenia* features a veritable who's who of Homeric lit: there's Agamemnon, the king who rallies the Greeks to war, cementing his position as the most powerful of the ancient monarchs; Menelaus, Agamemnon's ego-driven brother who would sacrifice everything to avenge his wife Helen's betrayal with the Trojan Prince, Paris; Achilles, the invincible warrior that symbolizes Greek might in the ancient world; Odysseus, an opportunist who looks to exploit power's foibles to amass his own power; and Clytemnestra, the queen who would be king. Below the surface, the film/adaptation has many layers of subtext, many of which are as topical today as they were when Euripides first staged his original version.

Ask the IT expert

A computer worm is a self-replicating computer program. It uses a network to send copies of itself to other computers on the network. Unlike a virus, they run as independent processes and they don't need a host program. A worm does not need to attach itself to an existing program. Worms occupy volatile computer memory instead of disk space. Because of this some worms can be destroyed by simultaneously rebooting all affected computers or by removing each one from the network and then rebooting them. Worms cause harm to the network, by consuming bandwidth. Worms spread by exploiting vulnerabilities in operating systems. You should update service releases regularly to avoid getting infected.

A *trojan* is a program that pretends to perform one task when in fact it performs another. It takes its name from the mythological Trojan Horse mentioned in Homer's *Odyssey*. The *trojan*, at first glance will appear to be useful software but will actually do damage once installed or run on your computer. Often a *trojan* will install a "backdoor" which allows the attacker to bypass normal authentication. Trojans can also cause a Denial of Service (DoS) attack, or even disable your security software. Unlike viruses and worms, *trojans* do not reproduce by infecting other files nor do they self-replicate.

Spyware is software that gathers in-

formation about the computer user without the user's knowledge or consent. Spyware can track your online behavior or capture credit card numbers, passwords and pin numbers and forward it to advertisers and criminals. Recently many companies and malicious programmers have been selling software that they purport to be anti-Spyware, when in fact they are the spyware. Not only you get spyware you paid for it too. If you get messages in your Internet Browser (Internet Explorer, Netscape, Firefox, AOL...) claiming that you are running low on memory or that you computer is infected, or you are entitled to a free scan, just close that window.

Known offenders include: errorsafe (AKA system doctor), Pest Trap, SpyAxe, AntiVirus Gold, SpywareStrike, Spyware Quake, WorldAntiSpy, Spylocked, SpyShredder, SysProtect, Spy Sheriff, Spy Wiper, PAL Spyware Remover, PSGuard, Malware, WinAntiVirus Pro 2006, WinFixer, Spydown, ContraVirus, UltimateCleaner, MagicAntiSpy, AV System Care, Registrycleanerxp.com, SecurePCcleaner, and PCSecure-system. Some of these companies have been successfully prosecuted and fined for their practices.
