AHEPA Chapter #99 Stamford, CT

Saturday, March 10, 2007, Stamford, CT - About 60 members of the local Greek-American community plus a few from New Jersey, New York and Connecticut had the privilege of an enlightening performance by the highly regarded writer and actor Yannis Simonides, who presented excerpts from the memoirs of General Makriyannis, a legendary military and political leader of the 1821 Greek War of Liberation from the Ottoman Turks.

The event was sponsored by the Stamford chapter of AHEPA in cooperation with the Church of the Archangels in honor of the 186th anniversary of the conflict, and it took place at the church hall. Greek appetizers were served and then the performance began. Mr. Simonides narrated the historical background in English and punctuated his narration with dramatized performances of stretches of Makriyannis' text in Greek, immediately followed by their English translation. The narration and dramatizations were accompanied by recordings of songs of the Greek fighters of the period (kleftika tragoudia) and a slide presentation that illustrated the text. Of particular interest were the slides of naif paintings by Zografos depicting several battles of the revolutionary war. The paintings were sponsored and directed by Makriyannis and are now at the Gennadios Library in Athens.

Audience reaction was enthusiastic. Many people gath-

ered around Mr. Simonides trying to express their appreciation and to learn more about Makriyannis, unwilling to let the magic of the moment die out. Several parents who had not brought along their teenagers rued the fact that they missed such an opportunity to engage and educate their children on an important aspect of the War of 1821.

In a rare show of support between AHEPA districts, Phil Vogis, Treasurer of District 5 (NJ/DE) attended the performance, took pictures of the principals and published a write up of the event in the District 5 AHEPA Voice.

Makriyannis emerged at a young age as a key general of the Greek Revolutionary army, and afterwards as one of the founders of the Modern Greek State and a formidable politician. Of humble origins, he learned to read and write as an adult expressly in order to produce this extraordinary document of the period during and after the Greek War of Liberation from the Ottoman Turks. On the basis of his Memoirs, his only opus, he has come to be regarded as one of the most impor-

tant Greek literary figures of the last two centuries.

Born in Constantinople and raised in Athens, Yannis Simonides is a Yale Drama School trained actor/writer and Emmy-winning documentary producer. Mr. Simonides' performance work includes plays by Euripides, Aristophanes, Shakespeare, Brecht, Korres and Pontikas, along with solo and ensemble pieces culled from the writings of C.P. Cavafy, General Makriyannis, Nikolai Gogol and Plato. He has received the support of the National Endowment for the Arts, the Greek Ministries of Culture and Foreign Affairs, the A. Onassis, L. Kostopoulos and Levendis Foundations.





Cooley's Anemia Thalassemia Cure Campaign

Thalassemia is the most prevalent genetic disorder in the world. Thalassemia is commonly found in Greece, Cyprus, Italy, Turkey, Iran, Southeast Asia, Southern China, India, the Caribbean, Africa, and in the Arabian Peninsula. There are millions of individuals afflicted with the



disease and there are millions of carriers of the disease.

Those who carry the thalassemia trait are said to have thalassemia minor. Most of the people who are carriers of the trait do not know it. A routine Complete Blood Count (CBC) should already be on file at your doctor's office. Ask your doctor to look at the Mean Corpuscular Volume (MCV).

For adults, if the MCV, is less than 75 and you are not iron deficient, you may be a trait carrier. Your doctor should then perform additional tests to confirm that you have the thalassemia trait. (Information from AHEPA.org website)

Mikis Theodorakis was born on July 29, 1925, on the island of Chios. He is perhaps the most important Greek music composer of the 20th century and one of the most significant in the world. He is known internationally for his scores in the Hollywood films, *Zorba the Greek* (1964) and *Serpico* (1973).

Politically, until the late 1970s he identified with the left; in 1990 he became a member of parliament with the centre-right New Democracy party, a move which he has since said he regretted. He has consistently opposed oppressive regimes and was a key voice against the Greek Junta of 1967-1974. He has been mentioned as a candidate for election as President of Greece, but he has refused to be considered.

Theodorakis' fascination with music began in early childhood; he taught himself to write his first songs without access to musical instruments. In Pyrgos and Patras he took his first music lessons, and in Tripolis, Peloponnese, he formed a one person choir (himself) and gave his first concert at the age of seventeen before a mirror.

Later he studied at the Athens Conservatoire under Philoktitis Economidis, and at the Conservatory of Paris where he studied musical analysis under Olivier Messiaen as well as conducting under Eugene Bigot. His time in Paris, 1954-1959, was a period of intense artistic creation for him. His symphonic works of this period, a piano concerto, his first suite and his first symphony, received international acclaim. In 1957 he won the Gold Medal in the Moscow Music Festival. In 1959, Darius Milhaud proposed him for the Ameri-

can Copley Music Prize as the Best European Composer of the Year, after the successful performances of his ballet *Antigone* at Covent Garden in London.

Theodorakis returned to Greece and his roots in genuine Greek music, and with his song cycle "Epitaphios" he contributed to a cultural revolution in his country. With his most significant and influential works based on the greatest Greek and world poetry – "Epiphania", "Little Kyklades", "Axion Esti", "Mauthausen", "Romiossini", and "Romancero Gitan"... – he attempted to give back to Greek music a dignity which he said it had lost. In developing his concept of metasymphonic music, he quickly became recognised internationally, and won acclaim as Greece's greatest living composer.

On 21 April 1967 a fascist junta seized power in a coup d'état. Theodorakis went underground and founded the Patriotic Front. The Colonels published Army decree No 13, which banned playing, and even listening to his music. Theodorakis himself was arrested on 21 August 1967 and jailed for five months. Following his release in 1968, he was banished to Zatonina with his wife Myrto and their two children, Margarita and Yorgos. Later he was interned in the concentration camp of Oropos. An international solidarity movement, headed by such figures as Dmitri Shostakovich, Leonard Bernstein, Arthur Miller, and Harry Belafonte managed to get Theodorakis freed. On request of the French politician Jean-Jacques Servan-Schreiber, Theodorakis was allowed to go into exile on 13 April 1970.

He gave thousands of concerts worldwide as part of his struggle for the restoration of democracy in Greece, met Pablo Neruda and

Salvador Allende, Gamal Abdel Nasser and Tito, Igal Alon and Yasser Arafat, François Mitterrand and Olof Palme. For millions of people, he became a universal symbol of resistance against dictatorship.

After the fall of the Colonels, Theodorakis returned to Greece. He participated in public affairs. He was elected several times to the Greek Parliament (1981-1986 and 1989-1993) and for two years, from 1990 to 1992, he was a minister in the government of Constantine Mitsotakis. He was then appointed General Musical Director of the Symphony Orchestra and Chorus of Hellenic Radio and Television for another two years.

Theodorakis has always combined an exceptional artistic talent with a deep love of his country. He is also committed to heightening international awareness of human rights, of environmental issues, and of the need for peace. It was for this reason that he initiated, together with the renowned Turkish musician and singer Zülfü Livaneli, the Greek-Turkish Friendship Society. Theodorakis is Doctor honoris causa of several universities, including Montreal, Thessaloniki, and Crete, and was nominated for the Nobel Prize for Peace in 2000. Currently he lives in retirement, publishing on music, culture, and politics. But on important occasions he never hesitates to take a position, as in 1999, opposing NATO's Kosovo war, and in 2003 against the Iraq War. In 2005, he was awarded the "Russian International St Andrew the First Called Prize" and the "IMC UNESCO International Music Prize".
